Water Department Report – March 2026 Regular Meeting

- Monthly coliform compliance sampling was completed with no issues.
- There was a meeting of the water/wastewater sector of the Vermont Cybersecurity Council to discuss potential partnerships with other systems for the cost of monitoring potential threats.
- There were many requests for the shut-off of water for meter repairs this past month.
- We had 10 water services freeze during the most recent cold stretch. Some of these places were vacant during a period of time this winter, and some have been problems in previous extreme cold conditions.
- A water main that serves the medical office and RNESU broke on Sunday, February 16th at 10:30 pm. The estimated loss of water was 350,000 gallons.
- The water superintendent will be speaking on a nationwide webinar on source protection in Vermont at the end of this month.
- Work on the office renovations continued as scheduled. The new doors and entryway will be completed in April.
- Water service entrance valve and outside faucet replaced at the office.
- We have not received a response from the state review of our Step 2 engineering agreement.
- Monthly regulatory compliance was completed with no issues.
